The "AB 32 Scoping Plan"

CARB's Role Under AB 32

- AB 32 grants CARB very broad authority to:
 - Maintain inventory
 - Regulate sources of GHGs throughout the economy
 - Combustion, refrigeration...
 - There are limits
 - Permitting, land use...
- ▶ AB 32 focused on 2020 GHG reduction target, but no sunset date
 - SB 32 focused on 2030 GHG reduction target
- CARB's implementation bounded by AB 32's parameters
 - > Planning document the Scoping Plan required before (most) regulations
 - First Scoping Plan must be adopted by 1/1/2009, updated at least every five years
 - CARB to be advised by an Environmental Justice Advisory Committee (EJAC)
 - Requires substantial public process

2019 Net Emissions: 418.2 MMT CO2e


Compared to...

2004 Net Emissions: 480 MMT CO2e


2020 Emissions Limit: ~430 MMT CO2e

2030 Emissions Limit: 260 MMT CO2e

What's Different About the "Carbon Neutrality" Scoping Plan

Carbon neutrality goal not (currently) a statutory mandate

Balance of GHG sources and sinks, not single emissions reduction target

Separate modeling process to determine Natural and Working Lands carbon target

20-year planning horizon (longest of any Scoping Plan


Multiple endpoints (2035 or 2045) for CARB Board to consider

2022 Scoping Plan Update Guideposts

Environmental Justice and Equity

Environmental justice is the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, national origin, or income with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies.

Non-exhaustive list!

Initial high level takeaways from Draft Scoping Plan

Very ambitious/aspirational language, but rel. light on detail

Knits together existing policies and executive orders

Sets carbon neutrality timeframe and accounting

Affirms commitment to incentives, regulations, carbon pricing

Some discussion of uncertainty

Repeatedly references EJAC recommendations but does not address core priorities

The Big Picture

- "Just a plan"... but regulations follow
- In all scenarios, fundamental changes as California moves to phase out combustion
- All buildings, all on-road vehicles, and some industries will electrify... maybe at the same time
- Significant challenges, but also significant opportunities, ahead



Local Actions

- Located in Chapter 5 and Appendix D & E
- Two main focus areas in Scoping Plan body
 - ▶ Local Climate Action Planning and Permitting
 - Unlocking CEQA Mitigation for Local Success

Local Actions (APPENDIX D)

- "Local Government Actions are Crucial for Supporting Attainment of the State's Climate Goals"
- Role of Local Climate Action Planning
 - Transportation Electrification
 - VMT Reduction
 - Building Decarb
- Role of Land Use Plans and Development Projects
- CEQA Discussion

Sustainable Communities (APPENDIX E)

- "Policy Framework to Advance Sustainable and Equitable Communities"
- Status Quo is "unsustainable"
- Need VMT reductions
- Suggested Actions
 - ▶ Plan and Invest in a Sustainable Transportation System
 - Manage Use of the Transportation System to Advance Climate, Air Quality, and Equity Goals
 - Shape the Deployment of New Mobility Options
 - Improve Alignment of Land Use Planning and Development with Climate and Equity Goals

CARB: Advanced Clean Fleets

Applicability to all Public Fleets

50% of additions of MHD vehicles must be ZEV in 2024, 2025, and 2026

100% of additions of MHD vehicles must be ZEV beginning in 2027

- Informal Open Comment Period
- Formal Proposal expected in September
- 1st Board Meeting in October
- Final adoption mid-2023
 - Less than 6 months from compliance start
