

Featured Project: Hilton Creek Community Services District

- The project will improve operations, save energy and money, replace aging equipment, and improve controls of their wastewater treatment plant.
- Project would not have progressed without SoCaIREN's professional engineering services, incentives, and financing.
- Rural and hard-to-reach (HTR) agencies are often behind on deep energy savings, challenging the notion of Industry Standard Practices.

City of Lindsay holistic energy project at Community Center

- SJVCEO enrolled the city with SoCalREN
- Completed energy dive on facilities
- Identified community center as high energy user
- Delivered incentive program project
 proposal
- Received council approval
- Beginning construction late 2022
- Estimated lifetime savings:
 - o 653,445 kWh
 - 12,606 Therms
 - \$201,810 lifetime savings







