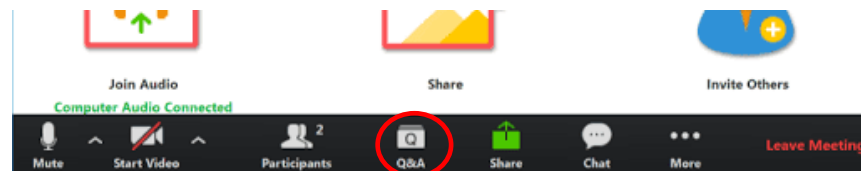

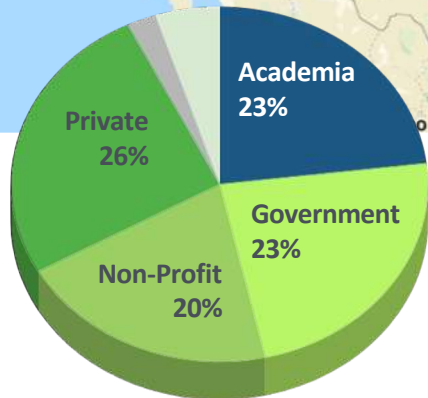

ASAP Policy Priorities

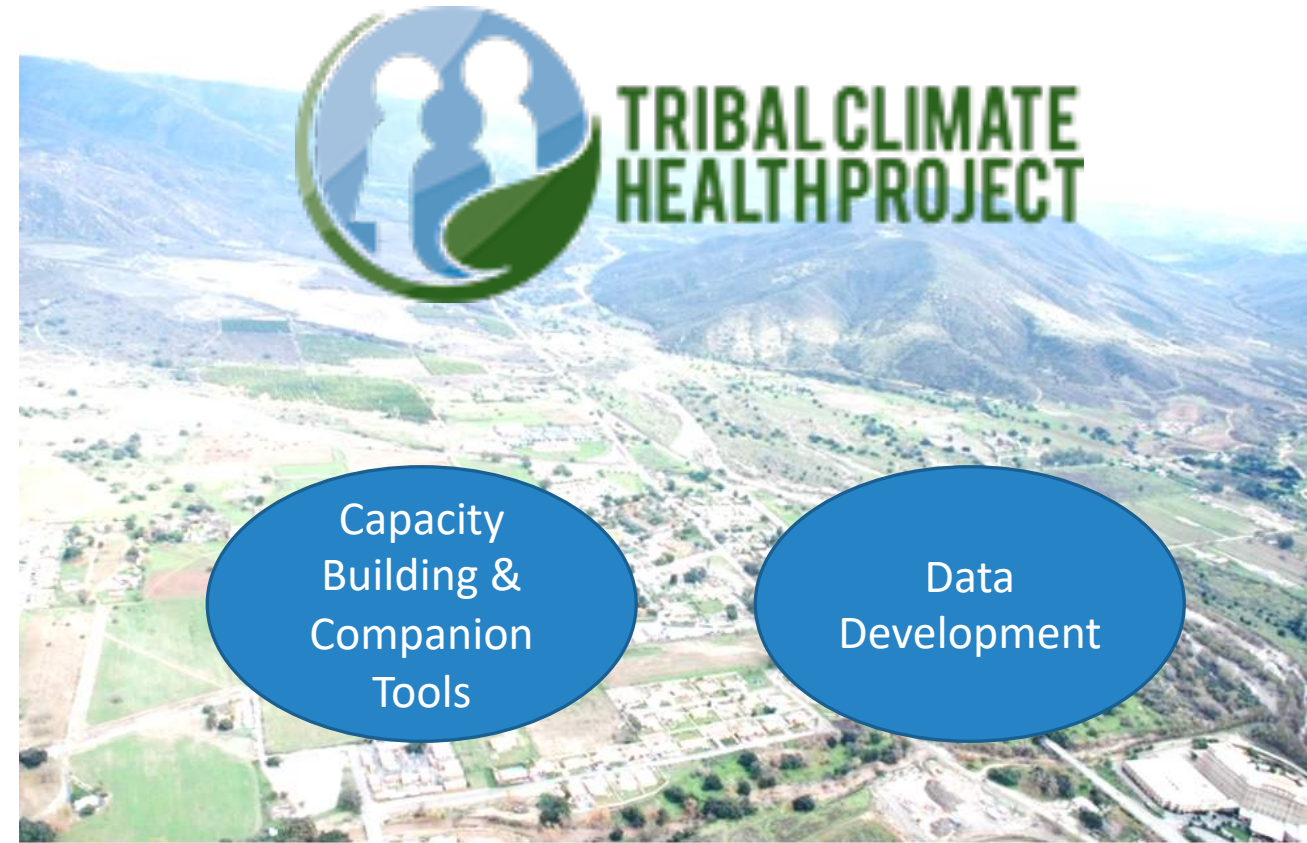
1. Establish standards for *climate data* and mandate use of future climate projections.
2. Treat climate change as a crisis and *prioritize justice and equity* in crisis response.
3. Overlay climate resilience needs on all *infrastructure* decisions.
4. Preserve, restore, and manage *natural systems* for climate resilience.
5. Define, develop, and train the climate change adaptation and climate resilience *workforce*.

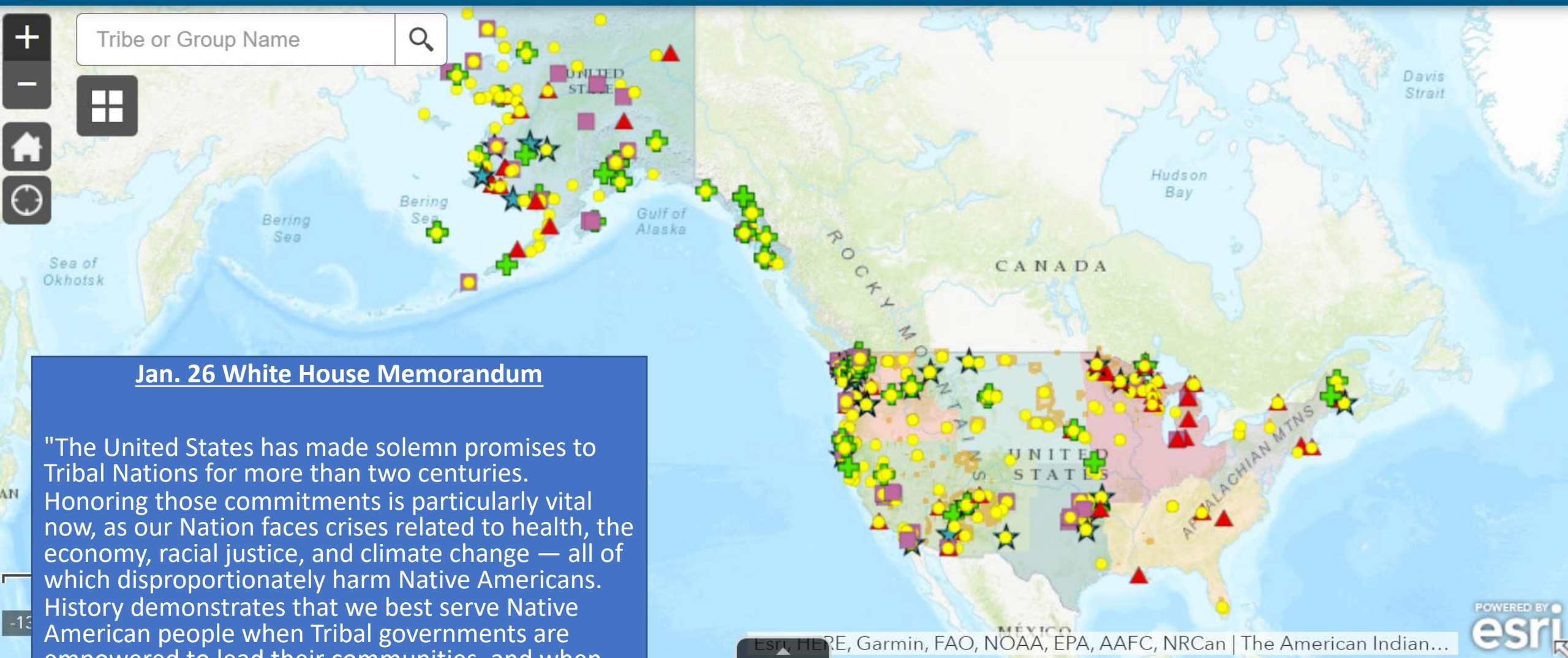


Tribal Climate Health Project

- National, federally-funded capacity building program led by the Pala Band of Mission Indians in partnership with Prosper Sustainably
- Compiles and develops resources and expertise to help tribes protect the health and wellbeing of their community in the face of climate change
- Trained over 1,000 tribal-serving professionals

Jan. 26 White House Memorandum

"The United States has made solemn promises to Tribal Nations for more than two centuries. Honoring those commitments is particularly vital now, as our Nation faces crises related to health, the economy, racial justice, and climate change — all of which disproportionately harm Native Americans. History demonstrates that we best serve Native American people when Tribal governments are empowered to lead their communities, and when Federal officials speak with and listen to Tribal leaders in formulating Federal policy that affects Tribal Nations."
