



Beaumont used "de-lamping" to more efficiently light the baseball fields at Rangel Park which translates to an annual savings of 5,000 kWh.



Benicia partnered with WattzOn to conduct residential energy and water assessments and distribute compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs) to over 200 homes. Assessments conducted with the assistance of high school students participating in the Students for the Advancement of Global Entrepreneurship (SAGE) Program.



Local Leadership Toward Solving Climate Change



Chula Vista collaborated with the California Center for Sustainable Energy and San Diego Gas & Electric to develop an Energy Showcase Home providing residents an opportunity to learn firsthand about home energy upgrades.



Rancho Cucamonga Library environmental education efforts feature a Kill-a-Watt check out program and the Going Green children's series allowing residents to check out a kilowatt meter which lets them measure the energy use and cost for their plugged-in appliances.

Riverside has partnered with Southern California Gas Company to provide free energy upgrades to low-income individuals through the Energy Savings Assistance Program.



San Diego County is implementing a Green Business Program that includes mailing thousands of energy surveys to restaurants throughout the County.



Local Leadership Toward Solving Climate Change



Santa Clarita worked with the Community Energy Partnership to benchmark three facilities in Energy Star Portfolio Manager. The City anticipates benchmarking its Activities Center and Transit Maintenance Facility in the future.



Simi Valley is implementing utility manager software networked among City facilities for real-time reporting and management of electricity, water, and gas usage.



Local Leadership Toward Solving Climate Change



Sonoma County implemented 38 energy efficiency retrofit measures in 24 county buildings, including lighting retrofits in 20 buildings and heating and air conditioning upgrades in four facilities reducing the county's energy utility bills by 33 percent, translating to \$1.6 million savings annually.



Tulare is retrofitting all city buildings — where cost effective — with high-efficiency heating and cooling systems, double-paned windows, efficient fluorescent lighting, programmable thermostats and reflective roof coating.
