

The Current State




Most of the CAPs in California outline a monitoring strategy in their CAP, but only half of the cities regularly track CAP implementation progress.



Barriers to Climate Action Implementation

- Lack of staff & resources
- Lack of quality tools & training
- Lack of accountability & structure
- Lack of accurate data
- Lack of a systematic framework

Cory Downs, City of Chula Vista



Achieve Results


