Local Government Commission Leaders for Livable Communities

AB 965 Levine

Would direct the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) and the California Building Standards Commission (CBSC) to propose electric vehicle charging standards for existing non-residential buildings by July 1, 2024. It also requires HCD to consider certain factors in developing electric charging standards for existing multifamily buildings.



Currently in the Senate Appropriations Committee.



AB 585 R. Rivas

Would establish the Extreme Heat and Community
Resilience Program through the Integrated Climate
Adaptation and Resiliency Program (ICARP) to coordinate
the state's response to extreme heat and urban heat
island effect (UHIE) and to provide technical assistance
and funding to local governments to develop
"comprehensive heat action plans" and implement
projects to mitigate extreme heat and UHIE.



Currently in the Senate Appropriations Committee.




AB 897 Mullin

Would Direct the Office of Planning and Research (OPR) to facilitate the creation of regional adaptation collaboratives, to create standards for regional climate adaptation plans, and to support implementation of climate adaptation plans. It would also encourage integration with other programs such as the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) hazard mitigation program.



Currently in the Senate Appropriations Committee.



SB 99 Dodd

Would direct the California Energy Commission (CEC) to develop a technical assistance and grant program to facilitate the development of local government plans and projects to reduce and offset the impacts of electrical power interruptions on critical facilities and to expedite permit approval for distributed energy resources.



Currently in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.



SB 551 Stern

Would establish the Zero Emission Vehicle (ZEV) Authority within GO-Biz to coordinate state efforts to promote ZEV's and to work with regional and local governments to facilitate and accelerate the transition to a zero-emission transportation system.



Currently in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.



SB 617 Wiener

Requires local governments to implement online, automated permitting for residential solar systems and would require the CEC to provide grants to assist the implementation of such systems.



Held in the Senate Appropriations Committee.



Online Solar Permitting

The budget bill, **SB 129**, appropriates \$20 million to the California Energy Commission (CEC) to make grants to local governments to implement online solar permitting.



Climate Resilience Package

The Governor and Legislature have agreed to spend \$3.7 billion over the next three years on climate resilience. The budget bill, **SB 129**, appropriates \$440 million for fiscal year 2021-22 for this purpose. The specific allocations of the funding are subject to negotiations and are expected to be included in a budget trailer bill that will be considered in August or September. Funding possibilities include adaptation planning and implementation, extreme heat mitigation and adaptation, urban greening, wetlands restoration, transformative climate communities.
