CivicSpark Program

CivicSpark is a Governor's Initiative AmeriCorps program dedicated to building capacity for local public agencies to address community resilience issues.

How it Works

CivicSpark places highly motivated emerging leaders with local organizations for 11-months to support research, planning, and implementation projects for community resilience.

Application Process

Step 1: Submit Online Project Application
Step 2: Application Review & Follow-Up
Step 3: Project Approval & Contracting
Step 4: Candidate Review and Interviewing
Step 5: Pre-Service Capacity Assessment

Look out for application deadlines for the next cycle starting January 2022!
