



The State of California appropriates billions of dollars for programs related to clean energy, climate mitigation and adaptation on an annual basis. As federal funding disappears, sources like those identified below account for the majority of dollars available for local and place-based energy and climate initiatives.

### California 2025-2026 Budget

- Governor Gavin Newsom released his proposed 2025-26 California state budget on January 10, projecting a small positive balance of \$363 million after two years of state budget deficits (source)
  - Budget Act of 2025 introduced in <u>Assembly</u> and <u>Senate</u> referred to budget committees
